**W**ater stress is accelerating due to increasing demand for water from an ever growing Arab population, and climate change is compounding the problem. The Millennium Development Goals (MDG) set a target to reduce by half the proportion of people without access to safe drinking water by 2015. "The Arab Human Development report 2009, presents compelling evidence that the burgeoning water scarcity problem in the Arab region presents a serious threat to human security.

*The Arab Water Week (AWW)* is the first regional meeting in the Arab region which will tackle water management issues through establishing innovative partnerships and



platforms of collaborative work on water issue in the region. The importance of this meeting lies in providing a platform for greater coordination among the existing network of key partners active in the water sector in the region.

*The Arab Water Week (AWW)* does not only provide an opportunity to enhance communication flows, synergies and the sharing of successful experiences, but as well, it will facilitate the creation of new partnerships that complement and maximize the impact of on-going work in this sector for the benefit of all countries in the region.

## What is the Arab Water Week?

*The Arab Water Week* is a high-profile international and regional event promoted to attract decision makers and water management practitioners and professional organizations internationally and in the MENA region. It will be firstly launched in Amman, Jordan from the period between 5th till 9th of December 2010, and organized by the Arab Countries Water Utilities Association (ACWUA) in partnership with the Arab Ministerial Water Council (AMWC) and the



Jordanian Ministry of Water and Irrigation (MWI). The first *Arab Water Week* will present ACWUA's first international conference and exhibition. ## Why to attend the Arab Water Week?

*The Arab Water Week* is an important and distinctive opportunity for water and wastewater management community in the Arab world and MENA region, it is the point where professionals, water management experts, private sector, and institutions of all types meets to exchange ideas, knowledge and experiences, discuss problems and get exposed to state of the art new technologies and solutions.



*The Arab Water Week* will provide a broad technical presentation and policy-based program, along with a specialized exhibition (**The Arab Water Trade Fair**) targeting water supply and wastewater vendor's and other service providers in the water sector.

## Who will attend?

ACWUA expect more than 500 participants and delegations to attend the first **Arab Water Week** in Amman. Many will be coming from ACWUA membership comprising of more than 200 individual members, and more than 70 water and wastewater utilities from 15 Arab Countries; Algeria, Bahrain, Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Mauritania, Morocco, Oman, Palestine, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates and Yemen.



**The Arab Water Week** is also aimed at senior decision makers from public and private water and waste water utilities/water supply companies, water ministries & authorities, environmental agencies & ministries, municipalities, utility operators, private sector companies and consultants and educational institutions internationally and across the region.

## Conference Themes and Topics

This year focus area will be **(Cost Recovery at water and wastewater utilities: Achievements, Challenges and Solutions)**. The following is a selection of key themes which the Scientific Committee is seeking contributions; papers addressing these issues from the Arab Region and international water community are welcomed and encouraged.

Conference key themes:

1. *Cost recovery and utilities strategic planning*
2. *Best practices in cost recovery at utilities: an option or a must?*

3. *Cost recovery and tariff restructuring: any water left for the poor?*
4. *Sustainable utility management: cost recovery implementation and obstacles.*

- ✓ Institutional restructuring to improve cost recovery.
- ✓ Policies for achieving full cost recovery.
- ✓ Utilities water demand management and cost recovery.
- ✓ Cost recovery models and information systems.
- ✓ Establishing strong accounting, recordkeeping and billing procedures.



- ✓ Capacity building as an effective tool for cost recovery.
- ✓ Developing innovative measures to reduce non-revenue water.
- ✓ Improving customer-oriented services and staff incentives.
- ✓ The social dimension of full cost recovery: ensuring access to water services for the poor.
- ✓ Next steps for achieving improved cost recovery.
- ✓ Cost recovery through energy management and energy efficiency.
- ✓ Customer information system benefits for cost recovery.

- ✓ Asset Management and cost recovery.
- ✓ Subsidies and overseas development assistance and micro-credits.

### IWA International Stream

As part of the *Arab Water Week* program, the International Water Association (IWA) will be organising an international stream to bring global perspectives and best practices to the programme. Themes to be presented and discussed by internationally renowned experts include: Sustainable cost recovery, operation and maintenance of water systems and performance based contracts.

## Invitation to submit a paper

Papers are expected to make an original and substantial contribution to the conference themes and topics. Speakers who are interested in presenting a paper should send an abstract for refereeing. Paper proposals will be selected by the *Arab Water Week* Scientific Committee to cover different areas, methods, approaches and positions.



Abstracts should be maximum 300 words. Each entry should incorporate the following information:

Author's(s') full name(s), Title – Position – Institution – Address for

correspondence– Theme of the paper (see conference themes), indicating a first and second choice – Title of the paper – Abstract of the paper.
